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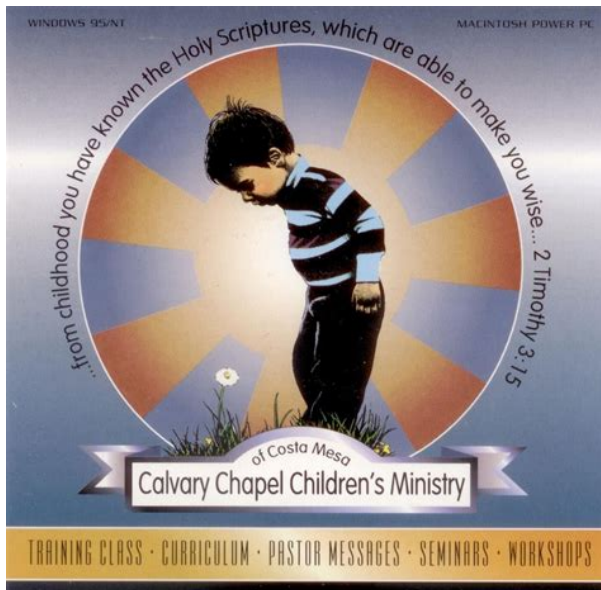

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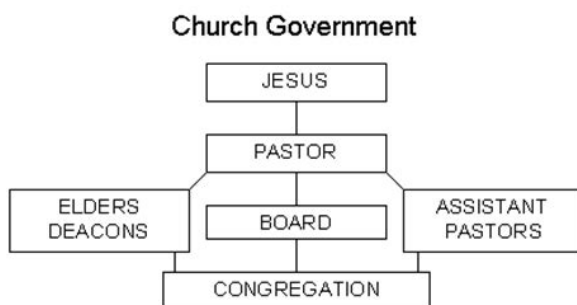

that we here at Calvary Chapel El Monte hold tightly to in how we handle things as servant leaders” And you shall teach them the statutes and the laws, and show them the way in which they must walk and the work they must do. 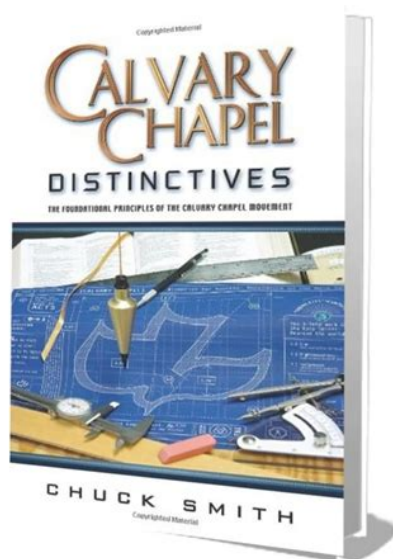


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It cannot act where there is cause or desert, it does not help, it is absolute, it does it all. Thus our

proper attitude should be, to consent to be loved, though we are aware of how unworthy we are of that love; to refuse to make resolutions and vows to be better, for that is to trust in our flesh; to expect to be blessed, though we know how unworthy we are of those blessings. Masculinity and femininity are not just social constructs. When God created mankind He did so male and female, and God uses gender to teach important spiritual truths about His relationship with His people. The Bible reveals God as masculine, and His people as feminine. This is why in the Church and in the home, God wants our relationships between the sexes to mirror His relationship with His people. God uses women in strategic ways, but pastoral authority and the teaching of doctrine in the church is reserved for qualified men. He declared of Himself as our example in this, "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." Matthew 20:28.

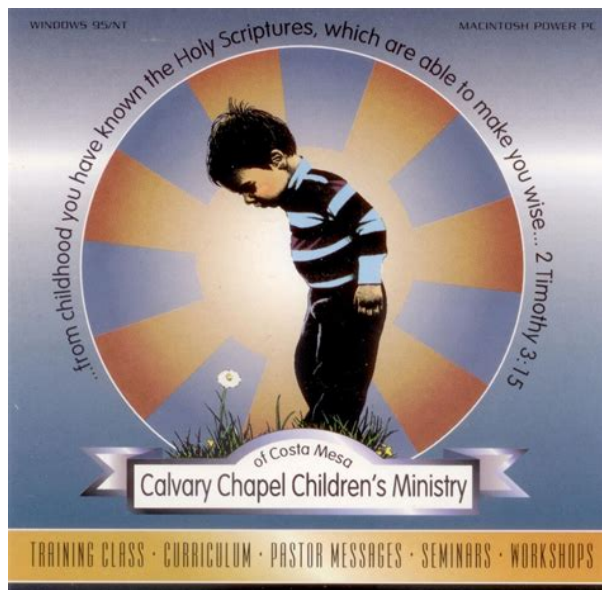
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As pastors we cannot represent our "Servant" Lord, without being servants ourselves. Pride, harshness, a sense of self-importance or a dictatorial spirit is inconsistent with Jesus' example. There are wonderful promises in God's word toward those who choose to live a life of servant leadership, including 1 Peter 5:5, "God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble." The question is was Paul only saying that one of the qualifications of a pastor is that he be able to verbally communicate theology, clearly. If that is the case, then even nonbelievers who read prepared scripts could qualify as a teacher of God's Word, and thus become a pastor. Many church pulpits are occupied by such men. It is the communication of spiritual truth, and God's Word is to be communicated by those who have personally partaken in the transforming power of the message that they now give. We take Paul's admonition to Titus to heart, where Paul instructed Titus to "in all things show himself to be a pattern of good works; in doctrine showing integrity, reverence and incorruptibility" Titus 2:7.

Because this is true, we place a high emphasis on not just giving out, but living out the gospel before the world, our family, and those whom God has entrusted to our care. It is a calling, something that we must do because we long for nothing else. And this longing to minister is undergirded by a hunger to please God, and a desire to walk worthy of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Note 1 Timothy 4:7-8; 6:11. Romans 15:7 says to “accept one another, just as Christ also accepted us to the glory of God.” Jesus accepted people as they were when they came to Him, so they could then be transformed by their relationship with Him. We at Calvary’s cherish being able to have an intimate fellowship with Christ that is relaxed, and not filled with a sense of judgment, suspicion, or unworthiness.

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“The ground at the foot of the Cross is level,” meaning no one is more holy or righteous than another there, but we, through Him, are all accepted. For this reason we accept each other, and seek to love one another John 13:34-35. Rather we seek to show them and tell them of the genuine love that we have found in Christ. Our utmost desire in our relationships is to both please the Lord, and provide a loving atmosphere so that everyone in the church can flourish. Coming to faith in Christ from every imaginable background, thousands of teenagers and young adults found themselves caught up in what would later be referred to as the Jesus People Movement. Ever since those early days, Calvary Chapel pastors have put an emphasis on reaching the next generation. This is quite a natural thing for most of us; it almost seems to be part of our spiritual DNA since many of us came to faith in Christ ourselves during our teen or young adult years. To this day, we hold the deep conviction that God has a special place in His heart for young people, from children right into the young adult years. With the smaller children, we want them to know how much God loves them and what a beautiful plan He has for their lives, so we do our best to communicate that in ways they will understand. Children’s ministry is a priority, not just a matter of keeping the kids occupied while the adults worship. We believe these young ones have a capacity to know and experience the Lord, so we do all when can to facilitate that. Our music should inspire them to worship Jesus; the ministry should be something that they are made to feel a part of. Allow the younger generation to engage in serving the Lord throughout the fellowship. Use them to teach the younger ones; include them on the worship teams; call on them to lead in prayer; allow them to share from the Word of God. Encourage them to be on mission in daily life as well as through unique ministry opportunities such as outreach and shortterm missions.

Ultimately, it is the young people who are going to reach the next generation—their generation.

That's what happened in the early days of the Jesus People and that's what will happen today. Remember the words of Jesus concerning the children "Let the little children to come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God" Luke 18:16. Let's pray the Lord will continually give us a heart for the children; let's pray for a great work of the Spirit among the younger generation; and let's make ourselves available to be used by the Lord to influence and encourage the next generation to know, love, and serve Him. It's a beautiful work of God to see what the world has cast off as hopeless wrecks transformed into glorious vessels of honor." We see this principle illustrated when Paul met with the Ephesian elders in Acts 20.

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As they were on the shore of the Aegean at Miletus, around the coastal area of Ephesus, Paul said that he was innocent of the blood of all men, "For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God" Acts 20:27. Now, how is it possible for a person to claim to have declared "the whole counsel of God". The only way a person could make that claim would be if he taught through the whole Word of God with them, from Genesis to Revelation. Once a pastor has taken his congregation through the Bible, then he can say to them, "I have not shunned to declare unto you the whole counsel of God." The crowds were gigantic and we were thrown into the ocean of ministry. The three of us were at every Bible Study that Pastor Chuck taught, plus we each had two or three studies going on at the same time either on campus or in homes. Two of the early books we heard, along with all the church goers, we learned the depth of Romans. We knew we would die to ourselves, pick up our cross, and follow Jesus. As a side note, I hear of "stars" or "Christian celebrity teachers" having their names and

conferences promoted. Pastor Chuck never has or would draw attention to himself. We were not following a man, but someone who always pointed us to Jesus. The book of Ephesians lit me up as I learned that I was God's workmanship. And that God gives gifts to men, each of us has a gift of a measure of faith. When we learned that Jesus gave men gifts to serve His people, and I think the "Equipping of the Saints" happened with great fervor among us interns. From the beginning I incorporated the things the Holy Spirit had taught me at Calvary Chapel Costa Mesa. Pastor Chuck's ministry is easily defined. And, it is that definition that I have used to plant new churches and start new para church organizations, to send people all around the world for God's glory. It's very birth and growth was because Jesus Christ gave himself for us on the cross, that He might give Himself to us through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, that He might live His life through us sharing the good news. We believe in and love sharing the good news of Jesus and do it with zeal.

In contrasting grace, mercy and justice, I see that justice is getting what I deserve, mercy is not getting what I deserve, and grace is getting what I don't deserve. In Newell's commentary on Romans 6 he has some great comments on grace, he declares that it is God acting freely, according to His own nature of love, with no promises or obligations to fulfill and acting righteously in view of the cross it is uncaused in the recipient its cause lies wholly in the giver.

The promise of this power Dynamis is a gift for every believer Acts 1:5 subsequent to the Holy Spirit's work of regeneration and to be received by faith as a separate and distinct work of grace to that of salvation. If we have complete confidence that it's His church, that He's going to build it, and that He's going to do His job, then all I have to do is be faithful. I simply need to watch His work, and then the pressure isn't on me. I don't get all hyped or pressured because the work of God isn't my responsibility. It's not my church. It's His church. I believe that it's very important to remember this, because if you try to carry the load and bear the burden, you'll find that it's too great for you. You'll find yourself under pressure to create schemes and hypes, and then you begin to push and manipulate people. That isn't the Calvary Chapel style. We're not into the carnal pursuit of new programs or spiritual hype to try to appeal to people. It's the Word of God that we trust in, that we teach, that we rely on. It's the foundation upon which we are built. It's inexhaustible. There's no burnout with it. It just keeps going on and on and on. It's His church so we don't have to sweat it. We're not really into seminars on how to build a church, how to create a userfriendly church, or how to develop a fiveyear plan. Who knows if we'll even be here five years from now.
